



St Hugh's College, University of Oxford Julia Wood Prize 2015

The Principal and Fellows of St Hugh's College offer the Prize, worth up to £500, for the best historical essay submitted by a pupil who, at the closing date, has been in the Sixth Form of any school or college for a period of not more than two years. The winning essay will be published on the College's website.

Essays should be submitted by a school or college, and no institution should submit more than four essays. **Candidates should state whether they are in Year Twelve or Year Thirteen, and should give a home and a school address, as well as an email address**. The choice of historical subject is left to candidates. Essays should be between two-thousand and four-thousand words; typed, or clearly hand-written, on one side of the paper only. Two copies of each essay should be sent; they will not be returned.

Essays should be sent - by Friday 10th July 2015 - to The Julia Wood Prize Committee, St Hugh's College, Oxford, OX2 6LE. It is hoped to make an award on or before Saturday 22rd August.

In 2014, the prize was awarded to Cecilia Murray-Brown, of St Mary's School, Ascot. Two further prizes were also awarded to Lily Spicer, of Oundle School, and to Joshua Stickland, of King's College, Taunton.
